Lead Hazard Control Program – Helps to create lead-safe homes for low-income families with children 6 and under, through lead hazard risk assessments and lead hazard control activities. Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program – Offers blood-lead screening and follow-up tests for children 6 and under with a focus on those children at highest risk for lead poisoning; referral for diagnostic services and medical treatment; assessment of environmental lead hazards when there is a confirmed case of lead poisoning; and community, professional and parental education regarding the hazards of lead poisoning. ### VACCINES FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM

The Pennsylvania Department of Health's Vaccines for Children ( VFC ) Program provides vaccines to children who do not have health insurance. Children who are insured but whose insurance does not cover immunizations (underinsured) are also eligible to receive federally funded vaccines at public sites, including Federally Qualified Health Centers and Rural Health Clinics. Families with medical savings accounts or health savings accounts are also typically covered under this program, since such accounts also have high deductible health plan coverage.
